### Year 11 Assembly

Yesterday, I led the Year 11 assembly and encouraged Year 11 to reflect on their two PPE performances by opening their second envelope. ## ATTENDANCE - LEAVE OF ABSENCE/ HOLIDAY REQUESTS

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority, they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

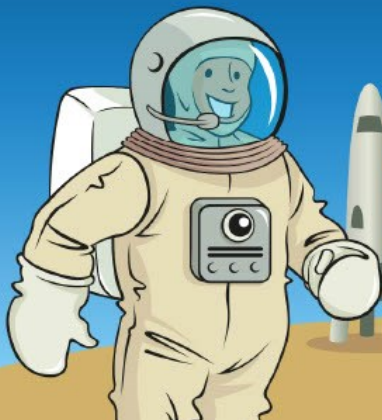

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING STUDENTS TRAVELLING ON DIAMOND BUS ROUTES 83 AND 87 (HALLMARK)

The Transport Team at Surrey County Council has advised us that there will be a change to the operator of routes 83 and 87 following complaints they have received regarding the service.

From 17 April 2023 the 83 will be operated by Cardinal Buses. The timetable is unchanged. The 87 will be operated by Stagecoach and the morning timetable into College is unchanged. There will however be a slight adjustment to the timings in the afternoon at the Chobham stops with students being dropped off approximately 2 minutes later.

Surrey has also advised us that there may be fare increases so please contact Cardinal Buses on 01932 820666 for route 83 and Stagecoach on 0345 121 0190 for route 87 regarding this.

Surrey has also advised us that Diamond Bus sold weekly tickets for their routes. If any parent/carer has any ticket disputes they should contact Diamond Buses direct on 01784 425621.

For any student who has a free bus pass, these passes are transferrable to the new services.

As Surrey County Council provide transport for students to Collingwood, we are unable to answer any queries you may have regarding these changes. For those that make payment for postage, exam certificates are usually despatched in December using Royal Mail's 'Signed For' service.

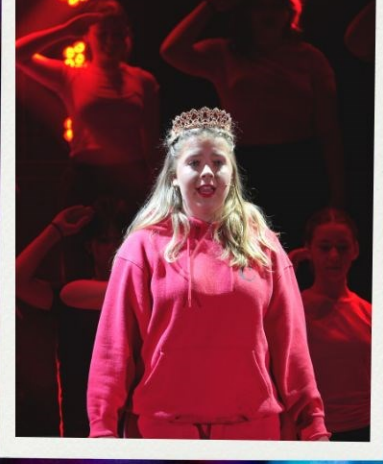
Certificates will be required by future employers and further education institutes. If you don't have your certificates when you need them in later life, the exam boards can provide a replacement statement of results but it is very costly.

The Blobs are simple. They deal with deep issues using the primary languages we learn from infancy – feelings and body language. This is why they are used with children as young as 4, all the way through to the elderly.

- Strategies to support students who are struggling to cope with their emotional intelligence
- demonstrate a wide range of tools for use in schools as well as curriculum scales for self-assessment.

"Ian Long is the co-creator of the Blob Tree visual tools. He has been a teacher for 17 years, a youth worker for 6 years and is currently a full time Blob illustrator/author/trainer.

The Blobs are accessible by all ages as there are no words. They are a simple discussion tool to enable deep conversations about feelings.

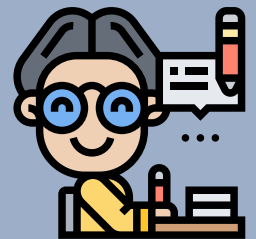

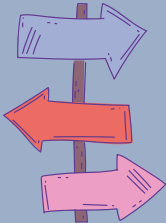
