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YEAR 9 STUDENTS ATTEND WCSA STEM DAY

On Tuesday 1 April Nine talented Year 9 students attended the Wellington College Student Alliance (WCSA) Year 9 STEM Day. The theme was to promote STEM subjects and team-building skills as well as an opportunity to make informed choices about possible education and career paths in STEM.



The students were provided with different challenging activities throughout the day that not only tested their general knowledge but also their resilience, participation and public speaking skills. The activities the students participated in were:



- Computer Science: using Cipher, decrypting secret codes into computer comments and instructions.
- Maths: generating numbers and sequencing them. Also, 'what is the Biggest Number challenge'. One of our students won this challenge and resolved the teacher's logic as to how the activity was designed - this led to great brainstorming and discussion for a while.
- D&T: creating a design to make the marble roll down their structure which took the longest time. This was very handson and showed their creative and thinking skills in action. One of our teams came second in this challenge.
- Lego: creating a Lego car and programming it to be the fastest moving object using computer programming.

Our students were great ambassadors for the College and demonstrated all skills with great confidence.

Exam certificate postage payment is available on ParentPay. Please ensure payment is made as soon as possible to ensure your child receives their exam certificates for the Summer 2025 season. This is of particular importance for those students in Years 11 and 13 who are leaving the College.

To avoid certificates being lost in transit or left crumpled at the bottom of a school bag, we encourage payment to be made for Years 9 and 10 too.

For those that make payment for postage, exam certificates are usually despatched in December using Royal Mail's 'Signed For' service.

Certificates will be required by future employers and further education institutes. If you don't have your certificates when you need them in later life, the exam boards can provide a replacement statement of results, but it is very costly.

Spots are limited and tend to fill up quickly, so please ensure students sign up as soon as possible by visiting M2 or emailing Mrs Truglio.









PARENT GOVERNOR VACANCY

I am writing to make you aware that there is a vacancy on the Governing Board for a Parent Governor. The Clerk to the Governing Board will begin the nomination process shortly. All parents/carers will receive a letter inviting nominations and explaining how this process works.

As Chair of the Governing Board I wanted to explain a little more about what governors do and hopefully persuade you to consider volunteering to join us. Governors are volunteers who give their time freely to support the education and care of all Collingwood students. We do this by meeting regularly to receive reports from, and ask questions of, Miss Watling, the College's Principal, and other members of the Senior Leadership Team, enabling the Governing Board to seek assurance that Collingwood is providing the best possible learning and care for all students.

School governing boards, including those in academies like Collingwood, are now expected to recruit governors with the skills and experience required to ensure we are effective in discharging our duties. We have a diverse range of skills and experience already represented on Collingwood's Governing Board and are looking for parents who have a general interest in education, the ability to analyse and understand data, or an understanding of finance and are comfortable asking questions. Training is provided for governors and we do expect all governors to engage in their own development as a way of ensuring our effectiveness as a Governing Board.

The Collingwood Governing Board meets once a term and operates five committees, which also meet each term. Governors at Collingwood sit on two of our five committees. Our meetings are at 8.00am and our aim is always to finish by 10.00am. Including reading documents, training and attending meetings, this equates for most governors, to roughly 50 hours each year.

If you are interested in the education of all students at Collingwood and are prepared to contribute some of your time and energy to support the College's continual strive to improve our provision, then please do consider nominating yourself for the vacancies.

Important Reminders

3-day Response to Parental Communications

We would also like to remind you that we have a **72-hour response** period for staff to reply to parental communications. It is obviously unreasonable to expect immediate responses to emails or messages when staff have full teaching and meeting commitments. This protocol also allows us time to investigate your communication and to reply with a detailed response to you. In all cases, we would ask parents to use the **tc@collingwood.surrey.sch.uk** email address to ensure communication is directed to the correct member of staff and to ensure an appropriate reply is made within 72 hours.

I very much appreciate your understanding and co-operation in adhering to these procedures and thank you for your support in maintaining positive College-parent/carer relationships.


