ATTENDANCE - LEAVE OF ABSENCE/ HOLIDAY REQUESTS

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority, they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.



STUDENTS TRAVELLING HOME IN PE KIT

Dear Parent/Carer

As another strand to our No Learning Wasted Strategy, we would like to trial students who have PE Period 5, to travel home in their PE kit. This enables us to extend the PE lesson to shortly before the bell, maximising teaching time.

Obviously, in the interests of hygiene and also our transport providers, should students be wet and/ or muddy they will still be asked to change back into normal uniform prior to departing at the end of the day.

This decision will be made by the class teacher on the day and is expected to be adhered to by all students in the lesson. In effect, everyone changes back into normal uniform or everyone travels home in their PE kit.

Dear Parent/Carer

We just wanted to touch base regarding the recent decision to make football boots mandatory, referring to the letter we sent out back in June 2023. We would like to thank the vast numbers of you that have included football boots as part of your son/daughter's PE kit; it is contributing towards a very positive culture for outdoor PE and you are supporting us teach our young PE students in appropriate footwear for different circumstances in PE, Sport and Fitness. This is having a huge impact on the quality of teaching and learning for activities like football and rugby, and we are delighted as a department to see students enjoying the benefits. The quality of work taking place with exam classes is much improved too.

As outlined in the letter, Collingwood College actively seeks to recognise the cost of living crisis that we find ourselves facing. Further to this, we as a department have consulted with other PE departments in the district and we are confident that we are moving towards a model that is in line with other schools in the area. Outdoor activities such as football and rugby will continue, even in rainy weather, and therefore it is imperative that all students are in suitable football boots. We have a small supply of boots that students can borrow if needed. Some year groups may experience a longer wait for their football or rugby block due to activity rotations and some year groups may experience more outdoor activity than others due to the curriculum offer and staffing. We can reassure you that the football boots you have purchased will be used and if you have any further questions or concerns please do not hesitate to contact me.


Maths

Lacey W have shown particular maturity within this unit.


