Introduction to booklet

The 8th Annual Parents' Survey was completed by 197 parents and carers in 2015. We are delighted that the overall results show 12 questions with satisfaction rates of over 90% from a total of 17 questions. This survey provides us with lots of detailed feedback which is very valuable.

For the second year running we were particularly pleased to have the endorsement of 97% of parents who believe that the College is well led and managed and would recommend Collingwood to other parents. The feedback has shown some improvement with Home Learning but this remains a key focus for the College. We need to do more to ensure that satisfaction rates for Home Learning match those in other areas of the survey.

Where there are common issues raised and for those questions which received the poorest satisfaction rates we have provided feedback on what actions we are taking to address your concerns.

Finally, we would like to thank all those parents who have taken the time to complete the survey and to tell us where we are doing well and how you think we could do better.

Actions as a result of your feedback

Behaviour

- Reinforce via assemblies and form tutor time the behaviour management policy.
- Remind students who they can approach in person to deal with problems and of the high levels of pastoral team availability
- Increase the profile of the Senior Prefect team around the College
- Have a focus on reducing low level disruption across the College
- Increase senior staff presence at gates and periphery of College grounds on entry
- Increase the presence and significance of our new anti-bullying ambassadors.

Parents' Evenings

- Ensure the most recent report data is available for Academic Review Days and Parents' Evenings
- Ask staff to display appointment order and times outside of rooms.

Home learning

- Re-iterate expectations of home learning in staff meetings and through training programmes
- Ensure teachers are following the home learning policy via the book scrutiny process.

Communication

- Offer a variety of timings for Parent Focus groups
- Always communicate the outcome of consultations via the Newsletter
- Respond to parental communications within three days, wherever possible
- Source a second supplier for uniform at the start of the Autumn Term 2015.

Electronic Devices

- Staff believe that moving towards a personal device for each student is not appropriate at present
- We will continue to monitor developments in the field
- Some departments will continue to encourage those students who have smart
 phones to use them when appropriate with other devices provided for those who
 do not have access to this technology.
