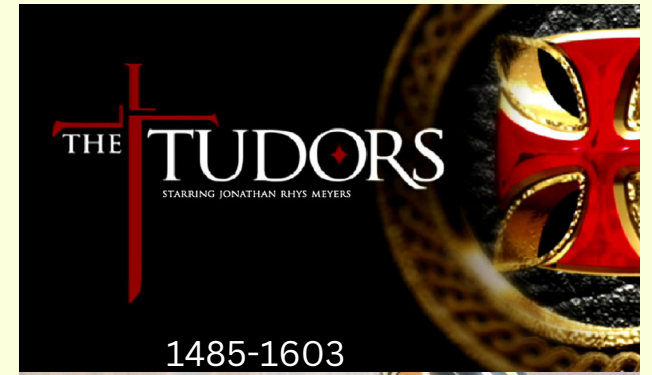

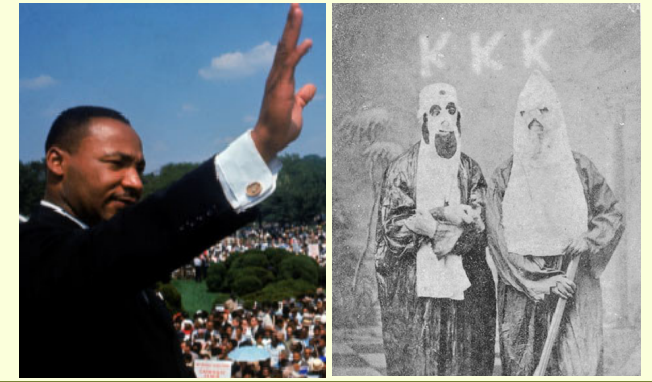

THE TUDORS: 1485-1603

Year 12 - Consolidation of the Tudor Dynasty: England, 1485–1547 - Henry VII's consolidation of power, relationships with Scotland, other foreign powers and government. Henry VIII's character and aims, relationship with government and society.

Year 13 - England: turmoil and triumph, 1547–1603 - 'the Mid-Tudor Crisis' under Edward and Mary and then the triumph of Elizabeth with foreign affairs and religious developments.

RUSSIA IN REVOLUTION 1917-53

Year 12 - The Russian Revolution and the Rise of Stalin, 1917–1929 - Dissent and Revolution, 1917, Bolshevik consolidation, 1918–1924, Stalin's rise to power, 1924–1929.

Year 13 - Stalin's Rule, 1929–1953 - Economy and society, 1929–1941, Stalinism, politics and control, 1929–1941, The Great Patriotic War and Stalin's Dictatorship, 1941–1953.
