

STEVE BARKER – Community Governor and Chair of the Governing Body

Steve has been a governor at Collingwood since 2000 and is also chair of the governing body at Bagshot Infant School and a Member of the EEEA (Engage Enrich Excel Academies) Multi-Academy Trust. Steve lives with his wife, who is a teacher, in Bagshot and all four of their sons attended Collingwood.

Steve began his career in marketing and advertising, working in a variety of roles with Boots, Unilever, Proctor and Gamble and Henkel.
